**Jackie Warren** is *Modern Masters* personified. A fixture on the Cleveland jazz scene for 15 years, Warren is known as “the first lady of Cleveland jazz.” A native of Colorado, she is a graduate of Oberlin College and earned a master’s degree in classical piano from Cleveland State University. Her keyboard artistry is displayed in solo, trio and big band venues. Warren’s brand of jazz has many flavors and can be experienced at the season opening concert on **September 13<sup>th</sup>**.

From Calhan, population about 600, on the Colorado plains, Jackie describes herself as “a jazz musician from a cowboy town.” She began studying piano at age 5 and participated in family jam sessions. She knew early that she wanted to be a musician.

Jackie will be joined by Peter Dominguez, bass teacher at Oberlin and Cleveland drummer Ron Godale, both talented and experience musicians.
